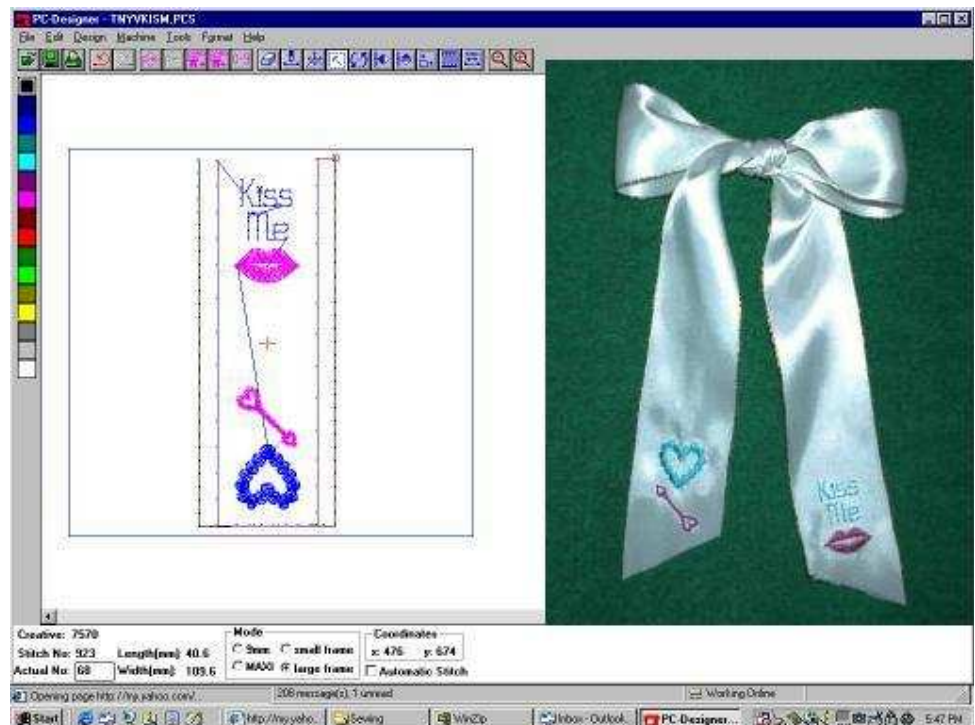


Embroidered Hair Bow by Mary Jane Allen
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Supplies:

Ribbon

Tear-away stabilizer

Embroidery threads

Hair barrette

Teeny Designs from Perfect Little Stitches

Embroider on ribbon by planning ahead. In the software, select 1:1 format. Hold your ribbon against the screen. Create two lines of stitches to mark the edges of the ribbon. With a new color (to create a color stop), make two more lines of stitches just inside the edges of the ribbon. Set the stitch length for these stitches to 4mm.

Center the designs you want to embroider between these lines. Arrange the designs so that the cut ends of the ribbon will be in the middle of the embroidery hoop. Hoop a layer of tear-away stabilizer and embroider the first color (these are the stitches that mark where to place the ribbon). Place the ribbon between the lines of stitching. Pin or hold the ribbon in place as the next set of stitches baste the ribbon to the stabilizer. Embroider the designs as desired.

Remove the basting stitches from the ribbon edges. Tear away excess stabilizer. Tie the ribbon to a hair barrette. Take a few stitches around the knot to keep the bow from coming untied.
