

Solar-Active Snowflake Scarf Project by Mary Jane Allen

### Supplies

3/8 yard polar fleece

Snowflake designs from Perfect Little Stitches -- Holiday Designs

Assorted solar-active embroidery threads

Sewing thread to match polar fleece

Water-soluble stabilizer

Trim the selvages from the polar fleece. Scarf will be about 13" or 14" wide. Finish the edges with a blanket stitch (# 33 on the Pfaff 7570 worked for me) or with your serger using thread that matches the scarf. For each color of solar-active thread, wind a bobbin with the same thread so that the scarf will be reversible. Place water-soluble stabilizer on top of the polar fleece at each end of the scarf, covering the full width and about 12 inches from each end. Pin the stabilizer in place. You may hoop the polar fleece with another layer of water-soluble stabilizer underneath or hoop just the bottom layer of water-soluble stabilizer and pin the scarf to that. Adjust the tension as for regular sewing so the back of the scarf will look like the front.

Start with the larger snowflakes and choose the color you most like. Embroider a different snowflake at each end of the scarf. Change to a new color (using solar-active bobbin thread to match). Embroider more flakes. Scarf is done when you have enough flakes to make yourself smile. Wash out the water-soluble stabilizer.
